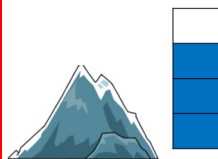

Continent: Europe

Key Vocabulary (please learn)

city	A large town often with a cathedral.
climate	General weather conditions for the country.
coast	Where the land meets the sea.
continent	A large area of land divided into separate countries. There are 7 continents. Italy is in the continent Europe.
country	An area of land controlled by its own government.
economy	The system of how money is made and used in a country or place. It is what people and businesses make and sell and how much money people spend on these things.
human features	Parts of the land made by humans (buildings, roads etc.).
mountain	A very large, steep hill rising upwards.
Landmark	An object, building or place that is easily recognized so helps you know where it is.
landscape	Everything in an area of land, including hills, rivers, buildings, trees and plants
Peninsula	A piece of land almost surrounded by water or projecting out into a body of water.
Physical features	Natural parts of the land (mountains, rivers etc.).
population	The amount of people living in a country, city or other place.
tourist	Someone visiting a place for pleasure, interest or holiday.
trade	Buying, selling or exchanging goods and services.
